### Confirmation

- Written confirmation of your registration will be mailed or emailed to you within 3 business days of receiving your registration form and fees.



Being Miss Tizzy - Miss Tizzy is an elderly, eccentric woman who the neighborhood kids love. They love her colorful house, vibrant garden, and quirky clothes - but most of all, they love the special attention she gives to them. Let's explore the book "Miss Tizzy" by Libba Moore Gray and discuss how you can be a Miss Tizzy in a quality program. During this session, participants will learn what educators in a quality program wear, what their daily schedule might look like, and most of all what they can do to ensure every child leaves their program saying "and they loved it."

**Environments That Create Curiosity** - Let's take a look at a REAL environment! Debbie showcases the environment that she cares for children in every day. Children deserve beauty as well as a room that functions to meet educational needs. Participants will look at different areas of the classroom, paying attention to the materials and the opportunities for spontaneous teaching moments. Debbie will highlight organization methods, loose parts, and opportunities for teaching through intentionally placed materials.

**Family Engagement is POWER!** Family engagement is the foundation of a successful early education setting. Following the principles of family-centered care, participants can adopt policies and build a program based on a solid partnership between the teacher and the family. This workshop will explore the principles of family-centered care and look at many ways programs can focus on the benefits of family engagement.

**Documenting Children's Learning Through Stories** - Observation becomes more meaningful when written in story format to honor the child and engage the parent. Let's look at the steps participants can take to start recording the learning taking place in the classroom in a beautiful way.

Quality matters in child care. Learn about the statewide Quality Counts Quality Rating System (QRS) for license exempt family child care providers, a program to help improve quality of care. The Orientation covers QRS eligibility and training requirements, application process, and supports and resources available. Providers serving children on the State Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) may also receive a bonus to the standard payment rate. A provider must attend this session prior to applying to Quality Counts QRS.

### PROGRAM FOR INFANT TODDLER CARE

### PITC MODULE 3: LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT

**CDA Content Area: 2, 3, 4, 7, and 8** 

This session explores brain development, early learning and language development, and appropriate curriculum planning for infants and toddlers. PITC's view of infants as active, self-motivated learners is explained and the role of the caregiver in supporting an infant's desire for exploration is considered. The perspective that is presented can be summed up in the following way: "All children are born wired for feelings and ready to learn" when provided nurturing relationships and a peaceful but engaging environment that supports all learners, including infants with special needs. Engaging discussion and activities support participant's learning.

## PITC MODULE 4: CULTURE, FAMILY, AND PROVIDERS

This training focuses on culture and its implication for families and providers. Participants will learn how family experiences, knowledge, and childrearing beliefs and practices can be incorporated into early care and classroom settings. Cultural expectations and biases will be explored and participants will have the opportunity to increase their cultural awareness in terms of how their assumptions may affect their interaction with young children and families. Participants will demonstrate their understanding of how family structures, diversity in social, cultural, linguistic, or religious backgrounds influence family approaches to parenting in children birth to three, each other, and the community. Participants will gain an understanding of how relationships among caregivers, infants/toddlers, and families can impact other child-family, child-practitioner, and practitionerfamily relationships.

### PITC MODULE 2: GROUP CARE

When: June 1st and 2nd 5:30pm - 9:00pm

plus a 2 hour online portion Where: Virtual Via Zoom

Cost: FREE

CDA Content Area: 1, 2, 4, 5, and 8

Group Care introduces special considerations in caring for infants and toddlers and six program policies that support the development of emotionally secure relationships and mental health in the group care setting. An overview of the content of Module 2explores the ideas of primary care, well-designed learning environments, positive impact of responsive caregiving routines, and individualized care on the well-being and development of children from birth to three. Attention is also given to how the policies of primary care, small groups, continuity of care, individualization of care, culturally responsive care, and inclusive care of children with special needs provide the foundation for high quality infant/toddler care. At the end of this module, participants will have the tools to use primary care in their home or classroom, make an engaging environment, assist children in daily routines, and individualize care for all children.
